

## Sentence Repetition Worksheets

This worksheet is designed to get students speaking and expressing themselves using English as quickly as possible without getting them bogged down in grammar. Depending on class ability and length, the worksheet can be used in a variety of ways, lasting 15 minutes or up to an hour. Here are some of the ways you can use the worksheet.

### Main Procedure:

- Introduce the topic of the worksheet and test how much the students already know. Talk them through the sentences and the meanings (translate if possible). There are little cartoons to help the students.
- Get them to tick for yes and put a cross for no.
- Now they must read the actions that they have ticked, one after the other.
- Repetition is key! Give each student 5 points for everytime they repeat all the sentences. Keep repeating until they can do it without looking.

If you want to get more out of the worksheet, there are extra procedures.

### Extra Procedure 1:

- Once the students have put the ticks and crosses, they can cut out the sentences with ticks. On a different sheet of paper (or coloured card) they can stick the sentences in order. This will help them visualise and complete the repetitions.
- Afterwards, they can also decorate the sheet how they want or draw topic related pictures and vocabulary. They will be more encouraged to keep their creation and it will serve as a more permanent reference for the target language.

### Extra Procedure 2

- For further practice, you can copy some of the sentences on the border with certain words removed. The students must fill in the gaps.

### Extra Procedure 3

- Choose one student's work at random. Read it out loud and the other students must guess whose you are reading.

### Extra Procedure 4

- Play a game where the faster the student repeats or makes the least mistakes, wins.

### Extra Procedure 5

- If the students are old enough, get them to either tell the truth or lie about their sentences and say ones that aren't true for them. The other students must decide if they are telling the truth or lying.
